

# Young Adults in Global Mission

## What is Young Adults in Global Mission?

The Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) program of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) invites young adults to embark on a life-changing journey.

Participants serve in a variety of fields in one of **10 country programs** and experience the transformation that comes with one year of international mission service. Volunteers serve in the spirit of accompaniment – walking together with global companions in mutuality, solidarity and interdependence.

In recent years, the YAGM program has sent **around 80 volunteers** into service annually. Volunteers are placed according to skill and experience in alignment with requests from our global companions.



## YAGM requirements

- young adults ages 21-29 with at least one year of post-high-school experience
- an ELCA connection
  - member of an ELCA congregation
  - student at an ELCA college or university
  - involvement in campus ministry, camp program or event
- a commitment to serving and building relationships with host communities
- flexibility, curiosity, patience and a sense of humor
- emotional health and resilience
- openness to exploring and deepening one's faith
- willingness to learn a new language (in some country programs previous foreign language skill is highly recommended)

## How is the program funded?

The average annual cost to support one volunteer in service is about \$15,000. Volunteers commit to a \$5,000 fundraising effort to help support the cost for their year of service.

Support from the ELCA is available to assist in raising these funds, as well as scholarship allocation based on need.

## What kind of support do volunteers receive?

- room and board
- travel to and from the country of service
- medical insurance
- monthly stipend allowing volunteers to live simply
- federal student-loan deferment or forbearance
- group retreats in the country of service that can include
  - faith formation
  - team building
  - social-justice education
- pastoral and administrative support from staff living in the country of service

## How do I know where I'll serve?

Candidates apply to the program as a whole and not to a specific country program. Candidate preferences are considered, but ELCA staff and the international program coordinators make the final country placement decisions. Willingness to serve in a variety of country programs strongly increases the chances of making a successful match between the candidates and the country program.
